Susan Minero, 69 of Old Bridge, passed away on November 16th 2015 surrounded by loved ones. She leaves behind to carry on her legacy, husband David Minero, son David Michael Minero and wife Erin, daughter Stacy Minero and Husband Howard Smith III. Born in Union City on July 6th, 1946, a daughter of the late Thomas and Ethel Morris. Susan worked at the American Kennel Club and General Telephone & Electric during the late 1960's and early 70's. “ In light of my Mom's passing I wanted to share some more insight into who she was and why she was so loved:

I have wonderful memories of birthday parties, holidays and family vacations. She loved decorating the house for Christmas and showering my brother and I with gifts on Christmas morning. Every gift was planned and personalized down to the last gift stuck in the toe of my stocking. She would rather watch everyone in the family open gifts vs. unwrap anything with her name on it.

My mom's artistic side consistently blew people away. She sketched faces to perfection, designed costumes for the local theater guild, and created custom drapery and pillows for friends and family. Those who enlisted her skills always offered her money and she always refused. People routinely showered her with compliments like "You're an amazing talent." She would wave at them with the back of her hand and say "Don't worry about it. I'm happy to help."

My Mom nurtured my love for arts and crafts. She bought me pads to sketch in, watercolors to paint with and beads to make jewelry. She bought me a loom to knit scarves and clay to make sculptures. She indulged my irrational obsession with sticker collecting and creating an immersive world for Barbie. When I was part of a program called "Education through Challenge" she was there helping me bring inventions to life, write short stories and invest in the stock market.

When I was in high school she gave up part of the house for dance routines, play rehearsals and my brother's jazz trumpet lessons. She would watch us perform and give us constructive feedback. In college, she was always on standby for advice and counsel. She wrote beautiful letters and sent killer care packages. She always tucked away money for shopping trips and unexpected treats.

She was a great storyteller with a dry wit and a big laugh. She made my Dad laugh like no one else could. She found joy in movies and music. I have vivid memories of her dancing around the house to Fleetwood Mac, Janice Joplin, Linda Ronstadt, and Harry Connick Jr. She had a passion for Broadway shows and saw a hundred plus plays over several decades. She loved the beach, vacationing to Hilton Head Island and taking cruises with my Dad and close friends.

She was a phenomenal cook. Despite her Irish background, she secured approval from my Italian grandmother whenever she served home made gnocchi. Her cheesecakes never cracked and her coffee cake could have launched a baking empire. She was a voracious reader and loved playing Mah-Jongg, Trivial Pursuit and Scrabble. She found joy in playing games with her girlfriends and was competitive in the best way possible. She enjoyed gardening and DIY projects. She could find anything you lost and fix anything that was broken.

Up until the day she passed my brother and I joked about who she loved more. The truth is she never chose favorites and one memory exemplifies this. There were a few years where my brother and I overlapped in sports. He was pitching in Little League and I was catching in softball, but the fields were separated by a half a mile.

Whenever games overlapped, she would walk from field to field, alternating three innings at a time to ensure she cheered us on with equal support.

When I was a little girl and ready to be tucked in my Mom would kneel next to my bed and softly and sing "You Are My Sunshine." It was as sweet as it sounds. While I know she is in a better place, these words have never rung truer:

You are my sunshine, my only sunshine

You make me happy when skies are grey

You never know, dear, how much I love you

Please don't take my sunshine away

My Mom was a beautiful woman with a huge heart and generous spirit. She was the brightest light in every room. She was an incredible mother, sister, wife and friend. She was loved dearly and she will be missed forever. Even though she is no longer with us, memories of her will always be a bright ray of sunshine, even when clouds are grey.
