December 14, 1947 - April 6, 2013

Brigitte Meitzner passed away on April 6, 2013 at her home in Old Bridge with her family by her side after a year-long battle with cancer. She was 65 years old. She is survived by her mother, Mathilde Lehnert, of Rockville Centre, New York; her husband of 33 years, Eric Meitzner, of Old Bridge; and two daughters, Erika Meitzner of Weehawken and Carolyn Meitzner of Manhattan. She was predeceased by her father, Ludwig Lehnert. Brigitte was born in Frankfurt, Germany, and moved to New York as a child. She graduated from the High School of Art & Design, Manhattan, and from New York City Community College. She worked as a commercial artist for firms in New York and Germany prior to assuming administrative responsibilities for her family's automotive services business on Long Island. She moved to Old Bridge in 1985. As a beloved daughter, wife and mother, she was known for her kind and generous nature, her devotion to her children's activities, and her attentive care giving for older relatives.
