Gerard Robert Callahan, 74 of Manalapan, New Jersey passed away on Thursday, February 13, 2025, at his home.

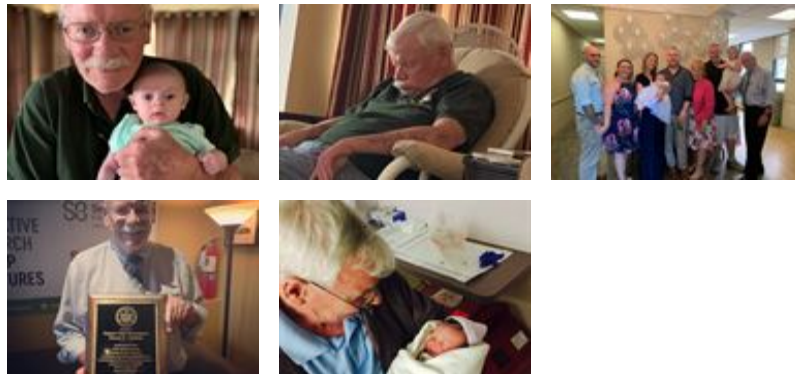
