Well, it has been almost 13 months since my brother Jimmy has left this temporary home to go to our forever home. He is still missed as we all continue to experience this huge hole in our hearts.

Growing up with Jimmy was a blessing. He was one of 2-big brothers who I was always proud to call my big brother. I felt protected because his reputation preceded him. When I told people my name, they all knew my brothers. It often made me feel safe because no one dared to mess with me out of fear of reprisal from my big brothers.

At times, like in grammar school, it did not 'always' work in my favor to say my name to teachers as they would often look at me and ask, "Your brother's are Danny and Jimmy?" (Anthony came after me so he did not have a chance to impact the teacher's perspective.) In those instances, their reputations probably made my life just a 'wee bit' more difficult.

Jimmy had an adventurous spirit and I would dare say a little reckless at times. He definitely added a few grey hairs to my mother's head.

Recently, as I have been looking through pictures, I noticed how many pictures there are of all 5 of us together in our yard just being kids together. Life was simpler then, and we had so much fun together. So much fun just being kids. And, so much of life to look forward to.

As the years passed, as we were busy attaining personal goals, as we watched our children grow, we always stayed connected and shared as much of our lives as we could. Holidays together, vacations together, parties, dinners, phone calls, through bad and good times we knew we could count on each other. "What a blessing God has given us."

God has given us a family, a history, a love for each other, and memories that many people unfortunately never get, do not value, or recklessly throw away. But 'this family,' and 'this sister,' will never throw any of it away. Not the memories, the love, the history, or the bond that can not be broken when one of them is no longer present in the body. Well, as we know, Jimmy has gone on to enjoy the presence of God, "the man upstairs" he would say when we talked about God. He was not afraid because as he told me, " If I don't beat this, I know where I am going."

Jimmy definitely lived his life on his own terms. He made decisions, was confident in his decisions, and did not apologize for them. He was an amazing husband, father, son, friend, and sibling who valued family and knew how to enjoy his family and life.

So 13-months later, when I remember the childhood memories, when I remember how we were God-parents for each others children, when I remember how he used to say, "Hi sis," when I think of the big crazy hat he wore to the beach and his big smile, when I remember him trying to spare his loved ones of the severity of his condition and the magnitude of his battle, when I think of my big brother, often as eyes are tearing up, I remember his relationship with God, I remember his adventurous spirit, and I look forward to when he will greet me at the gates of heaven.

I look forward to us once again having "so much fun" together. However, this time we will be in the presence of God. Life will once again be simpler, but this time we will have no more sorrow, mourning, or pain. I am sure Jimmy's adventurous spirit will have us walking on water and dancing on waves with our precious Lord and Savior. Again, we will have "so much of life to look forward to," only this time it will be for eternity in the new heaven and the new earth.
