Joseph Cavasin, 91 of Manchester, New Jersey passed away on Sunday, February 4, 2024, at Centra State Medical Center in Freehold, New Jersey.

Born Wednesday, November 2, 1932 in Neptune, New Jersey, Joseph was the son of the late John and Marion Cavasin.

Joseph was raised in Jersey City, New Jersey. He was a graduate of Dickenson High School. It was there he excelled at Baseball and was noticed by scouts from major league baseball. Joseph was drafted by the NY Giants. He spent time in the minor leagues with both the Cubs and Cardinals. After playing baseball Joseph served his country honorably in the United States Army, stationed in France.

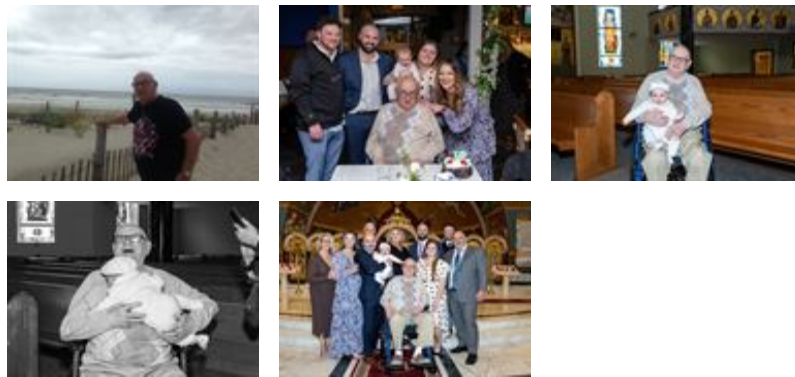
