Joseph Gattuso, of Kendall Park, New Jersey died on Sunday, April 9, 2017, at Princeton Medical Center, surrounded by his loving family.

Born July 17, 1929 in Rochester, New York, Joseph was the son of the late Michael and Carmela (nee Falzone) Gattuso.

Joe graduated from the University of Rochester in 1951 as a chemistry major. He was married to Jean Cisternino from 1951 - 1973.
