“The world has lost a renaissance polymath the kind we may never see again. He was a classic English gentleman. As Michael’s sister once said to him, “they don’t make men like you any more.”

Michael excelled in technology and engineering. He worked as a consultant for Sybase (one of the largest relational database vendors). He was a designer and builder. I remembered Michael described with pride and enthusiasm how he designed a plumbing system to get hot water upstairs without using a pump. The contractors didn’t understand how it would work and proceeded with much skepticism. Once completed, they were flabbergasted that it actually worked. Michael also built a pool in the backyard himself.

Michael enjoyed all modes of transportation, be it land, sea, or air. He loved getting behind the wheel, riding motorcycles, sailing, and flying. I once went sailing with him and Lynn. I wasn’t much of a sailor. Michael handed me a beer once we got on the boat. At one point, the boat was leaning at least 45 degrees. I got nervous thinking it was going to capsize. Both Michael and Lynn kept chatting and sipping beer as if it was all routine (maybe it was to them).

Michael was a classic English gentleman upholding traditional values in an assertive yet gentle manner. He held himself with dignity and confidence. He exemplified “confidence by competence.” He was the kind of role model we need for young men. He articulated with clarity and firmness. If observant, one might tell when something got on his nerves, yet he never lost his composure. He once told me the story that a rambunctious boy was running around in a restaurant where he and Lynn were dining. While many diners felt disturbed and annoyed, they remained silent. Michael being the man he was, called the boy over, firmly and gently told the boy that it wasn’t proper behavior. The boy scampered off. Later the boy’s father came over to their table and thanked Michael.

Michael, thank you for being who you were. I am grateful for your presence in my life. Your spirit shall live on within all people upon whom you have bestowed your wisdom and character.

“ Micheal, (Pappy) was my grandfather. He was a profound influence on my life. When I struggled academically as a child Pappy made me believe I was not stupid. He had many of the same struggles I had; and he was brilliant man. He made me believe that even if I did not get good grades that I was smart enough and tough enough to figure out a way to have a good life. The way Pappy treated his wife Lynn, had a deep impact on me as a young woman, the kind of relationship I wanted, and the kind of man I was willing to accept. As I became an adult, he and I would periodically get on the phone and talk for hours about history, and his hobbies. I loved to hear him talk, he was such a loveably excentric and unique person. I learnt an incredible amount from him. It felt like he knew something about everything, and most things about most everything. Most importantly I learnt never to compromise who I am or to allow others to influence my values. My grandfather was a gentleman, a true gentleman, he was never rude but neither did he care what anyone thought of him. He did not need the approbation of others, only to be satisfied with his own conduct and the morality of his own actions. Even though I can no longer call him or sit down to dinner with Pappy he will continue to influence me for the rest of my life. 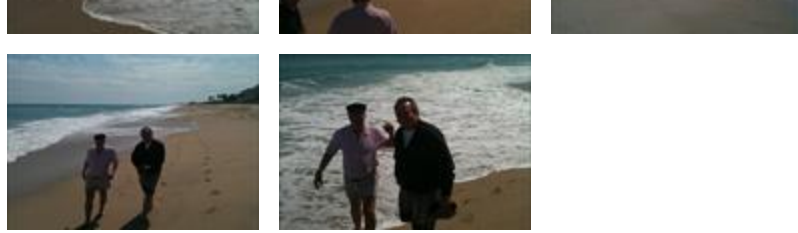

“ When I was a little one maybe 4 or 5 the song “Joy to the World” by Three Dog Night would play on the radio and my father would belt out the lyrics with joy, abandon, gusto. And I would join him with my little kiddo voice singing with all my heart (because that’s what he did) and I think that pleased him because one day he told me that it was possible to buy music, such a new idea to my little brain. He then explained that my brother and I were to start receiving a nickel a week. I so clearly remember him explaining, patiently, that this wasn’t an allowance, a gift, or a reward, but a contract, part of the contract of being part of a family. Mummies and Daddies and children all had roles to play in a family. The roles might change from time to time, but one of the things my brother and I could count on was our nickel a week IF we adhered to the family contract. (My father always spoke to us littles with utmost sincerity and with the most demanding vocabulary.)

After a time my father took me to the record store and handed me not a quarter, but my quarter, and I bought my first single, “Joy to the World”. I was so very proud, and so very happy, and I think my father was too because after I played my single my father called me took the record player and put on the album. We listened together and belted out all the words we could, and there it was, love, life, lessons from a wise man to a little girl and Joy to the World.
