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With heavy hearts and endless love, we share the passing of Robert Christopher Consola on May 25, 2025, at the age of 60.

Born in the Bronx on January 7, 1965, and raised on Staten Island. In the last five years of his life, Robert resided at CareOne in East Brunswick, a memory care facility where he received support for Alzheimer's. Even in the face of such a difficult diagnosis, his kind heart, warm spirit, and signature charm continued to shine through. He made friends easily, brought smiles to those around him, and never lost the spark that made him so special. He was the beloved son of Marie Consola (Romano) and the late Joseph Consola, and the devoted brother of Doris Crawley (husband Pierre) and the late Joseph Consola (wife Christine).

Robert was a graduate of Monsignor Farrell High School and attended the College of Staten Island. He built a successful career as a specialist on the floor of the New York Stock Exchange, a role that demanded sharp instincts, quick thinking, and strong character.
